
Rick Beets has asked to step away from the RMC presidency, so I've agreed to take that on. For the dual members, I'll still be president of something.

TECH TIP: COLD WEATHER TIPS

There are still a number of us who drive our Corvairs the year round. Spring/ summer/fall is when our concerns have to do with keeping the engine cool in hot temps on the highway. We have windows down and many open the fresh air vents under the dash for a flow of air through the passenger cabin. BUT when cold temperatures arrive that draft is not welcome.

Hopefully your heater is working as it should. The worst thing is having a cold draft on your knee or even worse is on your wife's ankle. The draft almost always comes from the fresh air vents and no matter how hard the knobs are pushed inward that cold air is winning.

Late models seem to suffer from the leakage more than earlies. Remove the grill and look at the rubber seal closely. If it has hardened/cracked/deformed or pieces missing it is impossible to stop the cold air. Fixing is fairly easy too. Removal of the vent door is simple, look at the spring loaded shaft and just push against the spring and pull outward. You can buy the foam flapper from vendors cut to

shape; I keep the flat rubber here and just cut the outline when needed. Grind the old rivets off and use the metal reinforcements as a pattern and pop rivet the pieces back together.

Also the large piece that covers the corner under the dash is caulked into place. If that caulking fails then cold air can leak around it. The fresh air comes from the grill on the front cowl and usually if seal is poor there will be water on your carpet after rain or washing your car. Two sheet metal screws hold it in place. Clean the old caulking and use either rope caulk or RTV in a tube for sealant.



Another cold air entry is a missing grommet around speedo cable into the car. I

have always been amazed that such a small hole partly hidden by the front of the body can let so much cold air under the dash. Fix is either used or new grommet, easy to do.

Now I have left out the roof rail rubber seals and quarter window seals, most of the time those are good already to help prevent air noise while driving down the road.
